David has over 12 years experience designing museum galleries, exhibitions, cultural heritage and architectural graphics for some of the world's top museums and high-profile organisations.

David started his career working for international museum designers Ralph Appelbaum Associates before joining Nick Bell Design in 2007. For five years he was Creative Design Manager overseeing and leading all exhibition graphic design and wayfinding projects. In 2012 David relocated to Manchester but continues to work with Nick Bell Design as a Senior Designer/Collaborator on special projects for the museums and heritage sector.

At Nick Bell Design he leads exhibition graphic design, environmental design and wayfinding projects. David is involved in projects from conception through to completion, working with clients to define scope and content as well as with contractors on details and finishing. He is one of our main client contacts and manages both creative output and project programming.

Notable career achievements include the award-winning permanent galleries at the London Transport Museum (for Ralph Appelbaum Associates, 2007) and the award-winning refurbishment of the Hancock Museum, re-named Great North Museum (for Nick Bell Design, in collaboration with Casson Mann, 2010), awarded Gold in the DBA Design Effectiveness Awards, 2011.

David has worked for a range of clients including English Heritage, V&A, Science Museum, National Trust, The Greenwich Foundation, Wellcome Trust and IWM. He was also an Associate Lecturer in Graphic Design at the London College of Communication (2004–8) and a Visiting Tutor at the University of Applied Arts in Vienna (2007).

David was born in London and studied graphic design at the London College of Printing and communication design at the Royal College of Art.
